### ASH WEDNESDAY/LENT

Ash Wednesday marks the first day of Lent and lasts forty days [excluding Sundays]. Genesis 18:27. Abraham remind us, "I am nothing but dust and ashes" [NIV]. Ashes are a symbol of humility and a visual reminder of the vast difference between creatures and their Creator:

Historically, the ashes used in an Ash Wednesday service symbolize the need for repentance and a change of heart. The focus is on preparing oneself for the Celebration of the Resurrection. This is a time to acknowledge sins, change inwardly, and prepare individually as a forgiven sinner to be received by the Lord.

What we hear during Lent is the power and possibility of the paschal mystery, and that the way of the cross, the way to Easter, is through death. To appropriate the new life that is beyond the power of death means we must die with Christ who raised for us. to live for Christ, we must die for him. New life requires a daily surrendering of the old life, letting go of the present order, so that we may embrace the new humanity. During the final week, Holy Week, we hear the fullness of Christ's passion, his death, and resurrection. From Jesus' triumphal entry in Jerusalem and on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, All of Holy Week focuses on the passion. As his followers, we travel Christ's path of servanthood through the Lord's Supper and the suffering of the cross toward the glory of Easter, all of which underscores the inseparable link service in preparation for Ash Wednesday. between the death and resurrection of Jesus.
